Before the U.S. Supreme Court, I was honored to represent Mr. Kieran Buckley, who has been fighting to recover his losses since he was defrauded nearly 15 years ago, when the sellers of a property he purchased failed to disclose material defects in the house. The sellers later filed for bankruptcy in attempt to discharge their debt owed to him. The Court (J. Barrett) issued a unanimous 9-0 decision in his favor on an important bankruptcy question, signaling that the Bankruptcy Code cannot be used as a shield for those who profit from fraud.
